About the Pew Research Center's survey of Italian adults

Results for the survey are based on telephone interviews conducted under the direction of GfK. The results are based on national samples.

General information on international survey research

Italy survey methodology, fall 2017 survey

Sample Design:	List-assisted Random Digit Dial (RDD) probability sample of landline households (15% of sample) stratified by region (NUTS2), and list-assisted Random Digit Dial (RDD) probability sample of cell phone users (85% of sample) sorted by mobile provider. Individuals within landline households are selected using the Rizzo method. Interviews in the cell sample are conducted with the person who answered the phone, if age 18 or older. For both landline and cell samples, up to seven phone calls are made to complete the interview with the selected respondent.
